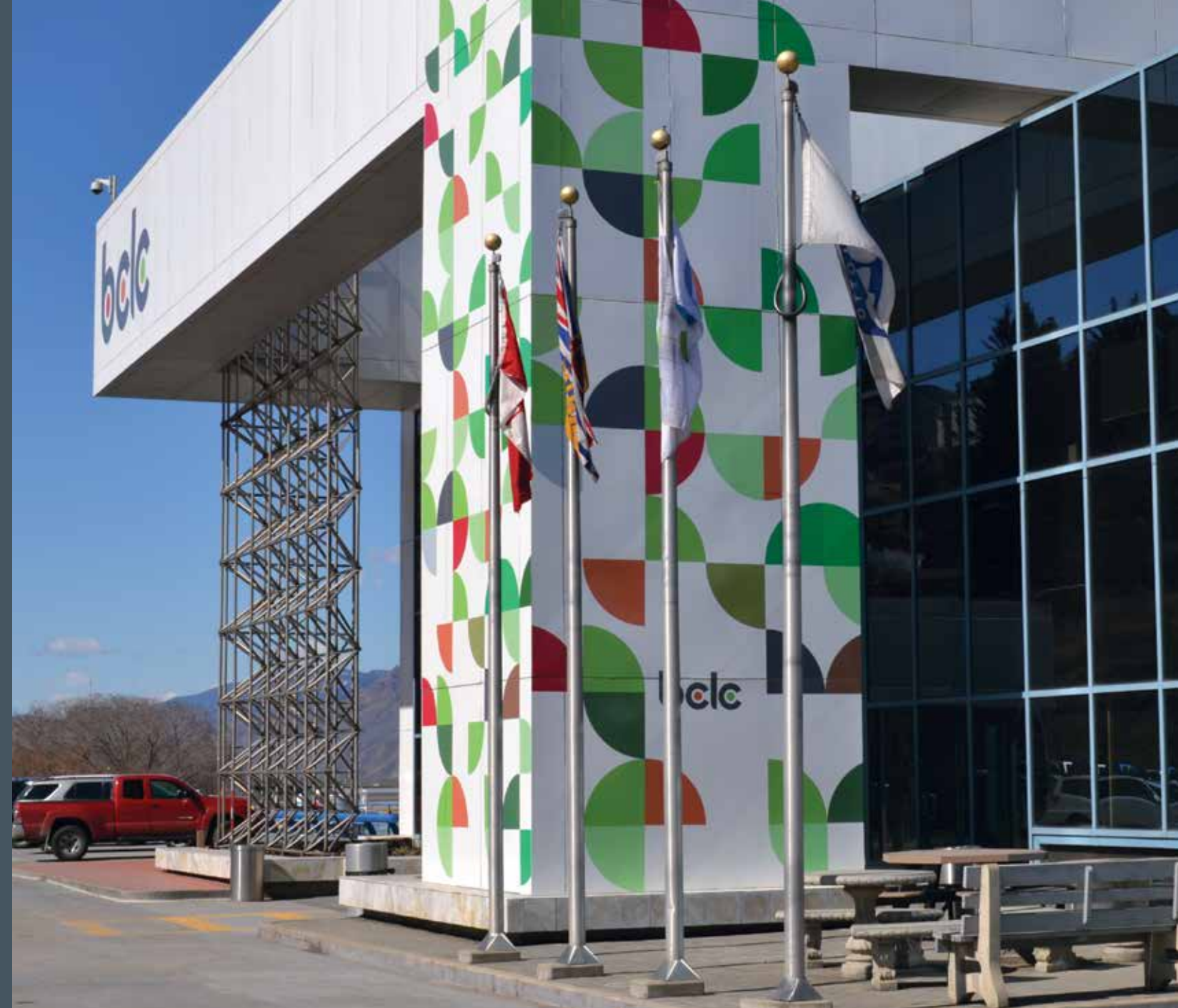


The gambling industry in B.C. employs 37,000 people in B.C. directly and indirectly.

Economic and Social Impact on Kamloops

BCLC's total economic impact on Kamloops is estimated at **\$47.3M** in 2013-14

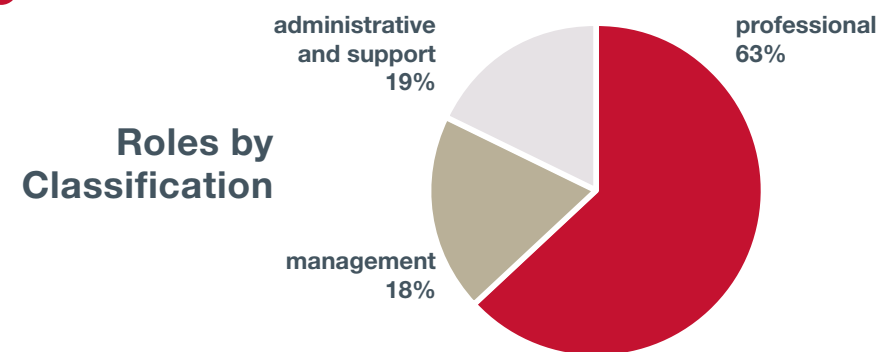


Employment 2013-14

BCLC is the eighth largest employer in Kamloops with an annual payroll of \$37 million.

Kamloops is BCLC's centre for technology and finance and also houses the corporation's customer support call centre, one of two prize claim centres and other support functions.

BCLC's total direct and indirect employment impact was 639 jobs. For every two jobs at BCLC one was created in the Kamloops economy.



Educated Workforce

Employees having some post-secondary education **96%**
 Employees having completed post-secondary **63%**
 Attended Thompson Rivers University **66%**

BCLC indirectly contributes to the socio-economic benefits associated with a higher proportion of post-secondary educated residents such as a safer and more attractive community, residents with better physical and mental health, and greater participation in societal activities such as volunteering, charitable giving, and voting participation.

Volunteerism

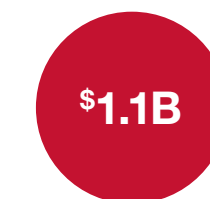
Nearly half of BCLC staff volunteered an average of 80 hours of their personal time every year to over 100 organizations in the community.

BCLC's 30-Year Impact

The year 2015 marks the 30th anniversary of BCLC. The cumulative impact of BCLC's head office in Kamloops has been substantial.

- An estimated \$1.1 billion dollars is the total cumulative economic impact in the Kamloops economy from 1985 to 2015.
- The total cumulative economic impact is the sum of an estimated \$805 million of total spending, including salaries and benefits, on goods and services from local businesses, and a cumulative multiplier effect of \$322 million over the 30-year period.
