- 7. "Mean bonus pay" refers to bonus pay when averaged for each group.
- 8. "Median bonus pay" refers to the middle point of bonus pay for each group.
- 9. "Pay quartile" refers to the percentage of each gender within four equal sized groups based on their hourly pay.

Data constraints

1.Employees were asked to provide consent to use gender information for the purposes of pay transparency reporting. Gender information was only included where BCLC received employee consent. 2. Prefer not to say/Unknown category includes employees who elected not to disclose their gender, and those who did not respond to a request to disclose their gender. 3. Non-binary category was suppressed in this report due to insufficient numbers to meet disclosure requirements which are intended to protect privacy. Number must be greater than 10, otherwise this category is suppressed. 4. Overtime pay is defined as money paid to an employee for hours worked in excess of the employee's usual hours of work. The money is based on a rate of pay that is at least 1.5 times the usual rate of pay. The calculation for overtime pay is the same regardless of gender. Variations in overtime pay are based on what people/positions are required to work overtime in the period and vary from year to year. 5. Overtime pay means and medians are expressed as a comparison of total annual overtime paid for women and Prefer not to Answer/Unknown to total annual overtime paid to men. 6. Bonus Pay is comprised of Referral Bonuses only (amounts paid to an employee for successfully referring a person who is hired to BCLC). This is the only type of bonus pay offered by BCLC. BCLC does not offer performance bonuses. The variation in bonus pay between men and women depends on how many referrals were done during the reporting period between the genders. This can vary from year to year. The referral bonus is the same regardless of gender.

* In accordance with the Pay Transparency Act and reporting rules designed to protect the anonymity and privacy of respondents, one or more gender categories has been excluded due to insufficient numbers to meet disclosure requirements.
