PLAYING IT FORWARD

LANGLEY

Local Governments that host a gambling facility in their community receive a 10 per cent share of the gambling revenue it generates each year. As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, in March 2020, all casinos, community gaming centres and bingo halls across B.C. were temporarily closed, including Cascades Casino Resort. With the closure, the City of Langley did not receive funds normally allocated to support local projects and initiatives.

BCLC and its casino service providers safely reopened casinos and community gaming centres on July 1, 2021 as part of Step 3 of the Province's restart plan. Players will notice robust health and safety measures when they return to Cascades Casino Resort.



SPOTLIGHT: GAMBLING REVENUE IN LANGLEY

In 2018, the City of Langley allocated \$1.5 million from their share of provincial gambling revenue for hosting Cascades Casino Langley towards parks and playground upgrades. One highlight was a dinosaur-themed play space in City Park that has been crawling with young dino-enthusiasts.

SPOTLIGHT: MEALS ON WHEELS SOCIETY

Langley Meals on Wheels promotes health and independence by providing quality, nutritious and affordable meals to anyone in need.



A \$93,500 Community Gaming Grant in 2020 ensured teams could deliver over 40,000 meals to those in need. The grant also helped subsidize meals to low-income people so those most vulnerable remained connected, and helped pay staff so that donations could be directed to community needs. During the pandemic, it became apparent how much need there is in the community and the Community Gaming Grant ensured that Meals on Wheels never missed a day of delivery or outreach services, programs could be expanded to respond to community need, and the leasing of a new space that will become a one-stop shop for people was secured so they can connect, learn, teach, share, and be nourished.
