

While it is still early in our social-purpose journey, our commitment to corporate citizenship — through player health; employee, community and stakeholder engagement; diversity and inclusion; and environmental sustainability — has never been stronger.

BCLC's social purpose is the north star that guides our organization to continue being a positive force for good.

Each year, local governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility receive a 10 per cent share of the net gaming income those facilities generate. Last year, 32 Host Local Governments across B.C. received **\$66.9 million** in provincial gambling revenue to fund local projects and initiatives

GIVING BACK IN KELOWNA

Playtime Casino Kelowna asked their employees to nominate their favourite local charities to share in a total donation of \$12,000. A dozen charitable and community organizations were selected to receive \$1,000 each, including Elevation Outdoors (youth outreach), Rescue Ranch Society (small animal rescue), and Central Okanagan Hospice House Palliative Care.

Playtime Kelowna also supported Okanagan Ride for Dad with a \$7,000 sponsorship and JoeAnna's House with a Friday Jeans Day fundraiser of over \$1,100.

PLAYING IT FORWARD

IN KELOWNA

In 2021, the City of Kelowna allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue from hosting Playtime Casino and Chances Kelowna to support crime prevention, public safety, and policing.

One such initiative was 9pm Routine, a community-based crime-prevention and education program aimed at reducing opportunistic property crime. The 9pm Routine is a movement supported by police forces around the world that encourages residents to make a regular routine of conducting security checks to prevent theft in their homes and vehicles, on a nightly basis at 9pm.
