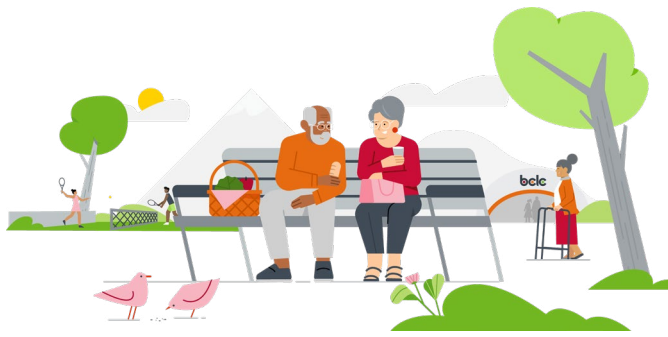
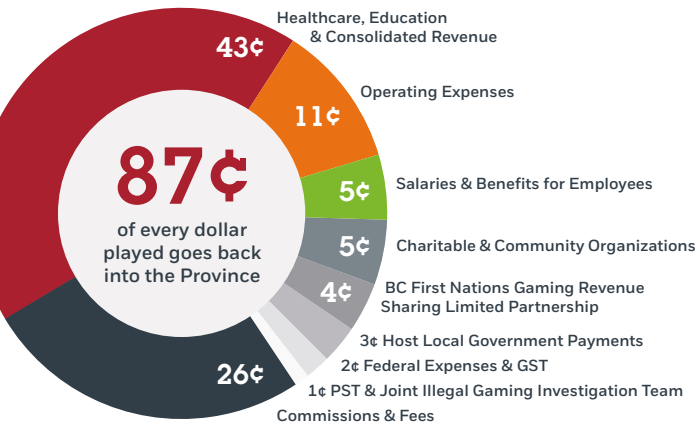

Chances Terrace works with many local vendors, including Tri-City Refrigeration, Hartman Electric, and Aqua Plumbing. In 2022, Chances Terrace supported a variety of organizations including the Terrace Art Gallery and Concerts in the Park.

Chances Terrace also supported Terrace Search & Rescue with a donation of \$5,000 last year. Terrace SAR is run by 70 professional volunteers, providing emergency rescue and search services across Northwest British Columbia. These funds will support Terrace SAR's operations as well as the building of their new SAR headquarters.

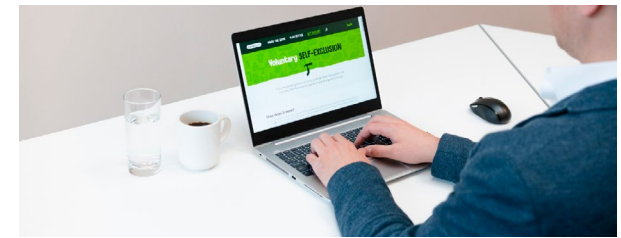


GENERATING WIN-WINS IN TERRACE

In 2022, the City of Terrace used a portion of its share of provincial gambling revenue generated at Chances Terrace to support various community initiatives.

Some funds were used to upgrade buildings at the municipal cemetery, a significant and valued site for many community members. Plans for gambling revenue funds in 2023 include firehall upgrades and repaving projects.

PLAYER HEALTH GAME BREAK



It's important to take breaks when gambling. It's a way to pause and regain perspective. However, when it becomes harder to fit in breaks and gambling just doesn't seem fun anymore, BCLC's Game Break program can be the first step towards getting help.

In January 2023, BCLC launched Game Break, a reconceptualized self-exclusion program with an active reinstatement process that strives to reduce stigma and empower individuals to make the right choices for themselves.

When a Game Break term is completed, individuals take part in an online program that encourages self-reflection and awareness before they return to gambling, if they choose to at all. If they are not ready, they have the option to extend their break.

SPONSORSHIP TERRACE RIVERBOAT DAYS

BCLC proudly supports Concerts in the Park at Riverboat Days, year after year. The event is the largest community festival in northwest B.C., highlighting the culture and heritage of Terrace and surrounding region. The program offers a wide-range of entertainment featuring sports events, music, theatre, historical tours and visual art displays.

Each year, municipal and First Nation governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. Last year, 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. received **\$100.8 million** in provincial gambling revenue to fund local projects and initiatives.
