



Each year, municipal and

Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments
across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

GAMBLING REVENUE

FUNDS LOCAL INITIATIVES IN DAWSON CREEK

Last year, the Province of B.C. allocated **more than \$140 million** to not-for-profit organizations through the Community Gaming Grants program.

SPONSORSHIP

WILDFIRE SUPPORT

The team at Chances Dawson Creek stepped up for local families after devastating wildfires broke out across parts of British Columbia and local residents were ordered to evacuate their homes. With all hands on deck, Chances Dawson Creek team members volunteered before and after their shifts in order to prepare and serve meals for 200+ people in need at the Ovintiv Event Centre. To ensure there was no waste, leftovers were delivered to a nearby community agency, the Nawican Friendship Centre.

DAWSON CREEK BENEFITS

In 2023, the City of Dawson Creek allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue for hosting Chances Dawson Creek to a range of community initiatives.

\$455,000 was used to support operations and development of the Dawson Creek Public Library, a vital cornerstone for the community. Funds were also used to support the Dawson Creek Step Up "N" Ride Society, a local non-profit dedicated to providing door-to-door, wheelchair-

accessible transportation service in the community, as well as the Dawson Creek Art Gallery.
