

First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2023/24, BCLC generated \$94.5 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

PENTICTON BENEFITS

In 2023, the City of Penticton allocated funds from its share of provincial gambling revenue from hosting Cascades Casino Penticton to supporting community services and infrastructure projects.

The City used a part of its gambling revenue in 2023 to continue supporting parklands and sports fields in the community, which provide people of all ages with outdoor space for casual gatherings and organized events as well as various sporting activities such as soccer, baseball, slo-pitch, fastball, rugby, field lacrosse and more. Revenue generated from gambling was also put towards transportation initiatives in the form of upgrades to bike lane signage and was used for dog park improvements throughout the city.

DID YOU KNOW? LOCAL IMPACT

Cascades Casino Penticton is one of the founding sponsors of Operation Duck Drop, a grassroots initiative dedicated to supporting local non-profits that need resources and support to fulfill their impactful missions. With Cascades volunteers both in the water and on land, 2,000 rubber ducks raced down the Penticton Channel, raising \$2,000 for the Brain Injury Society in May 2023.
