

TERRACE BENEFITS

In 2023, the City of Terrace used its portion of provincial gambling revenue generated from Chances Terrace to support road repaving projects and upgrades to the City's fire department.

About \$200,000 went towards the Fire Department, to purchase a new self-contained breathing apparatus compressor and build an outdoor structure to house the compressor outside of the firehall, as well as \$14,000 towards installing new overhead doors.

The City of Terrace also used \$310,000 to support various pavement overlay projects, including purchasing a second-hand grader for specific use by roads crews and resurfacing asphalt roads with significant deficiencies. Some of the areas addressed in 2023 were Kalum Street,

Davis Avenue, Soucie Avenue, Halliwell Avenue, Thomas Street and Lanfear Drive.

Chances Terrace is a proud supporter of various community events and initiatives in the Kitimat-Stikine region, playing an active role in enriching the local culture and community spirit.
