St. Eugene Resort's ownership consists of four Ktunaxa communities including the ?Akisgnuk, ?Agam, Yagit ?a·knug ‡i 'it (Tobacco Plains), Yagan nukiy (Lower Kootenay) and the Kenpesg't (Shuswap Indian Band).

Together they make up St. Eugene Mission Holdings Limited (SEM).
