Kamloops Benefits

In 2024, the City of Kamloops allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue to a variety of capital and community-focused initiatives. Funding supported North Shore Public Realm Improvements, including lighting and banners, and \$686,903 was used to fund the first year of a three-year Community Outreach Support and Clean Team program. Additional projects included \$99,989 for playground equipment, \$6,143 for park signage, \$7,306 for pool toys and rides, \$20,000 for the Public Access AED Program, \$23,594 for museum restructuring, and \$48,485 for parking lot upgrades at the Kamloops Seniors Community Centre.

In 2025, the City plans to continue funding the Community Outreach Support and Clean Team, enhance the Seniors Centre parking lot as part of the first completed project under the Build Kamloops Program, and begin work on the Digital Strategy (DES) to transition permitting processes to

a digital platform.
