Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2024/25, BCLC generated **\$86.6 million** for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

Langley Benefits

In 2024, the City of Langley allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue toward several municipal projects. This included \$2.8 million for the acquisition of land for future municipal buildings, \$2.8 million for the purchase of a new Fire Ladder Truck, and \$2.5 million for infrastructure improvements.

In 2025, planned allocations include \$4.9 million for the replacement of water and sewer infrastructure, and \$1.9 million for upgrades to roads, sidewalks, and multi-use paths.

Did You Know?

The City of Langley's 2024 capital investments included the purchase of a new Fire Ladder Truck using funds from its share of provincial gambling revenue.
