Mission Benefits

In 2024, the City of Mission received \$751,034 from its share of provincial gambling revenue through Chances Mission and interest earnings. These funds supported a range of capital and community projects, including:

- \$344,016 for new breathing apparatuses for the Fire Department, replacing outdated equipment.
- \$427,543 for pool, weight room, and fitness equipment.
- \$38,755 for park upgrades.
- \$17,478 for playground equipment and landscaping.
- \$38,900 for property acquisition.
- \$6,428 for bus shelter improvements and stop upgrades.
- \$1,875 for the Downtown Façade project.
- · Additional funds supported public art and standardized signage.

Did You Know?

In 2024, Mission's Fire Department replaced its outdated breathing apparatuses with modern equipment using funds from the City's share of provincial gambling revenue.
