SPONSORSHIP

Seafest

BCLC sponsored SeaFest 2024 in Prince Rupert, an annual waterfront festival that brings the community together for a weekend of entertainment, local vendors, and family-friendly activities. Held in the city's downtown and marina areas, SeaFest featured a parade, live music, food trucks, and cultural performances, celebrating the coastal spirit of the North Coast. The event remains a key highlight in Prince Rupert's summer calendar.

Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2024/25, BCLC generated **\$86.6 million** for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

Prince Rupert Benefits

In 2024, the City of Prince Rupert allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue to support both community programming and infrastructure improvements. A portion of the funds was distributed as grants to local organizations, including \$20,000 to the Prince Rupert Arts Council, \$159,000 to the Lester Centre of the Arts, \$158,788 to the Museum of Northern BC, and \$15,000 to the Kwinitsa Railway Station Museum. Additional grants included \$9,000 to the Prince Rupert Racquets Association and \$30,000 to the Prince Rupert Special Events Society.

The remaining funds (\$195,894) were invested in road paving as part of the city's ongoing capital improvements.

Did You Know?

The Kwinitsa Railway Station Museum, supported by Prince Rupert's 2024 gambling revenue, offers visitors a glimpse into the city's early development. Located in Waterfront Park, the museum showcases exhibits portraying the daily life of the station master and crew, highlighting Prince Rupert's transformation from a tent town at the terminus of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway to its establishment as a city in the 1920s.



Community Support



In 2024, Chances Prince Rupert supported Pawz United Rescue Society and the Prince Rupert Library.
