In fiscal year 2024/25, the Province of B.C. distributed \$97.6 million to First Nations in B.C. as part of the BC First Nations Revenue Sharing Limited Partnership. First Nations receive a seven percent entitlement of BCLC's net income through the BC First Nations Gaming Revenue Sharing Limited Partnership.

All Top Prizes were claimed, and the Grand Prize winner — a North Vancouver resident — donated four of the 13 suite spots to the Make-A-Wish Foundation. Tickets were sold at retailers across B.C.

Squamish Nation Benefits

The Province of B.C. created BCLC 40 years ago with the purpose of giving back to British Columbians and to help communities grow. Since that time, thanks to our players, BCLC has delivered \$30 billion in net income back to the province to support communities, provincial programs and essential services that we all rely on.

Since 2010, the Squamish Nation has received more than \$3.4 million in Host Local Government payments. Last year, the Squamish Nation received \$244,921 generated by Chances Squamish.
