Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2024/25, BCLC generated **\$86.6 million** for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

GAMBLING REVENUE

Funds Local Initiatives in Terrace

Last year, the Province of B.C. allocated more than \$140 million to not-for-profit organizations through the Community Gaming Grants program.

Riverboat Days

In 2024, BCLC sponsored Terrace Riverboat Days, the city's annual celebration of Fraser River heritage and community spirit. The multi-day festival included a parade, live music, food vendors, artisan markets, family-friendly activities, and a drone light show, showcasing the region's culture and vibrant waterfront atmosphere. Riverboat Days continues to be a highlight of Terrace's summer community calendar.

Terrace Benefits

In 2024, the City of Terrace allocated gambling revenue to complete several infrastructure projects that contribute to the maintenance and improvement of city services:

- Pavement Overlays: \$145,549 was used for road resurfacing, addressing significant deficiencies like potholes and cracking
- Sidewalk Resurfacing: \$62,916 went toward sidewalk repairs and improvements to maintain and enhance the condition of city sidewalks
- Eby Storm Inlet Repairs: \$15,208 was spent on repairs to the water controls at the overflow inlet, improving the storm water and sewer system
- Road Crack Sealing: \$100,098 was used to increase longevity and reduce future maintenance costs of mid-life asphalt
- RCMP Parking Expansion: \$20,000 helped add six additional parking spaces at the RCMP detachment

LOCAL IMPACT

Community Support

In 2024, Chances Terrace made several community donations, including \$10,000 to the Dr. REM Lee

Hospital Foundation's Closer to Home campaign, \$10,000 to the Terrace Art Association, and \$5,000 to the Terrace Community Foundation. An additional \$5,000 was donated to the Terrace Riverboat Days Society. As part of its annual Remembrance Day Slot Tournament, Chances Terrace also contributed \$1,025 to the Royal Canadian Legion Poppy Campaign.

Chances Terrace also donated \$5,000 and an old shuttle van to My Mountain Co-Op, the non-profit organization that runs Shames Mountain ski area.
