# **Williams Lake Benefits**

In 2024, the City of Williams Lake allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue to support a range of community organizations, infrastructure improvements, and cultural initiatives. Key investments included:

- \$160,000 to the Williams Lake and District Chamber of Commerce for operations at the Tourism Discovery Centre.
- \$70,650 toward the Williams Creek Waterfront Boardwalk Feasibility Study, contributing to planning and assessment of potential waterfront development.
- \$53,200 for upgrades to the Scout Island Nature Centre, supporting facility improvements at a key environmental education site.
- \$42,000 to the Cariboo Chilcotin Conservation Society for its Water Wise Program, focused on community-based water education, and \$37,000 for its Waste Wise Program.
- \$25,000 to the Williams Lake Stampede Association to support the city's annual rodeo event.
- \$24,300 for Arts Centre upgrades.
- \$24,000 to the Museum of the Cariboo Chilcotin Society to assist with operations.
- \$22,920 to Cariboo Chilcotin Partners for Literacy.
- Additional grants ranging from \$2,500 to \$20,000 were distributed to various community groups.
