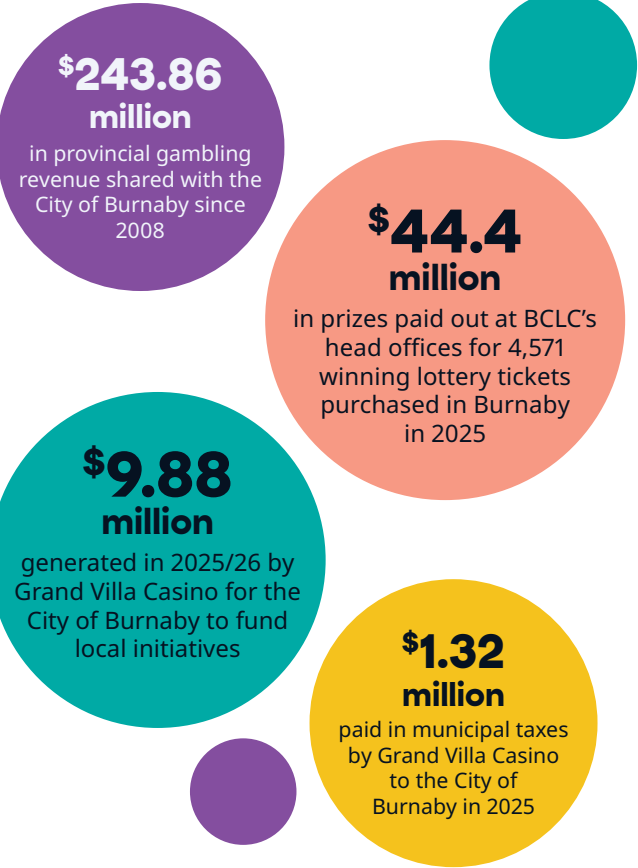

Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2025/26, BCLC generated \$83.4 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

GAMBLING REVENUE

Funds Local Initiatives in Burnaby

Last year, the Province of B.C. allocated \$140 million to not-for-profit organizations through the Community Gaming Grants program.

In addition to supporting community initiatives, Grand Villa Casino also participates in a chopstick recycling program through ChopValue, donating used chopsticks collected on-site. From the casino's opening day in 2008 through April 2025, Grand Villa Casino recycled 402,899 chopsticks, representing 19,615 kgCO₂e in emissions savings.

Pinoy Festival

BCLC proudly supported the Pinoy Festival in Burnaby, celebrating Filipino culture, heritage and community during Filipino Heritage Month. Held at Swangard Stadium, the free, family-friendly festival brought people together to experience authentic Filipino cuisine, live music, cultural performances, an artisan and vendor marketplace, art exhibits, and a showcase of Filipino traditions. The festival welcomed visitors of all backgrounds to celebrate the richness and diversity of the Filipino community.

Burnaby Benefits

In 2025, the City of Burnaby allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue to support a variety of capital projects and community initiatives.

One of the capital projects was the Burnaby Lake Pavilion Spectator Area project. The City invested in continued work which included extending the service life of the grandstand, bridge pier, dock, and associated ramps, expanding banquet hall space, updating portions of the guardrail network, and replacing deteriorated facility components.

Additional funds were allocated to the ongoing installation of electric vehicle charging infrastructure at civic facilities, including supporting utility upgrades and charging stations. The City also provided a fifth grant of \$1 million to the Burnaby Hospital Foundation's Proud History, Bright Future campaign.

Community Support

Grand Villa Casino supported a variety of community organizations and events in 2025 through volunteer participation and event sponsorships.
