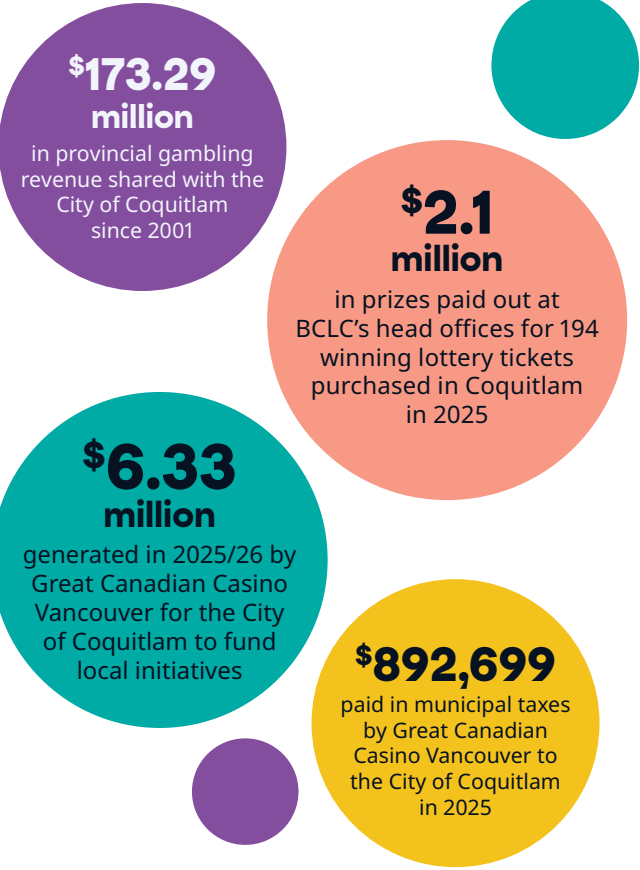

Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2025/26, BCLC generated \$83.4 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

Funds Local Initiatives in Coquitlam

Last year, the Province of B.C. allocated \$140 million to not-for-profit organizations through the Community Gaming Grants program.

Celebrate BC

BCLC proudly supported the inaugural Celebrate BC Day festival in Coquitlam, bringing communities together to celebrate the rich history, diverse cultures and shared heritage of British Columbia. Held in partnership with the Kwikwetlem First Nation and S.U.C.C.E.S.S., the free, family-friendly event featured live entertainment, cultural performances, family activities, local food vendors, and BC's Largest Wild Salmon BBQ. The festival welcomed people of all backgrounds to celebrate what makes British Columbia unique.

Coquitlam Benefits

In 2025, the City of Coquitlam used a portion of its share of provincial gambling revenue generated at Great Canadian Casino Vancouver to provide grants to local non-profit and community-based organizations. The Spirit of Coquitlam Grant program helps these organizations host events, offer support programs, purchase equipment and realize capital projects to advance community initiatives that benefit local residents. As examples, last year, this program provided funding to the Theatrix Youtheatre Society, the Tri-Cities Pride Society, and the Coquitlam Cheetahs Track and Field Club. From 2023 to 2025 the City has approved over \$1 million in Spirit of Coquitlam grants across 123 projects led by local non-profit and community-based organizations.

In addition to continuing the Spirit Grants program, in 2025 the City used some of the revenue to provide funding for road safety and sidewalk improvements through projects and programs including the City's Sidewalk Program that provided upgrades along Draycott Street, Haversley Avenue and Cornell Avenue as well as work in the Burquitlam area over the past year. Funding was also used to renovate several city facilities, including City Hall.

LOCAL IMPACT

Community Support

In Coquitlam, Great Canadian Casino Vancouver supported a range of community organizations and initiatives in 2025 through sponsorships and in-kind donations. Total community contributions for 2025 were \$36,650, including \$8,500 for their signature charity, Tri-City Transitions Society. Additional sponsorships included \$9,000 for BC S.U.C.C.E.S.S. Foundation, \$1,250 for BC SPCA Tri-Cities, \$5,500 for Coquitlam Firefighters Charitable Society, \$1,500 for KidSport Canada, \$3,500 for Immigrant Link Society, and \$1,400 for Crossroads Hospice Society.

Team members organized a clothing drive in which 20 bags and 30 boxes of clothing and household items were collected for Big Brother Canada. They also donated over 100 books to Big Brothers Big Sisters, with an estimated \$500 value.
