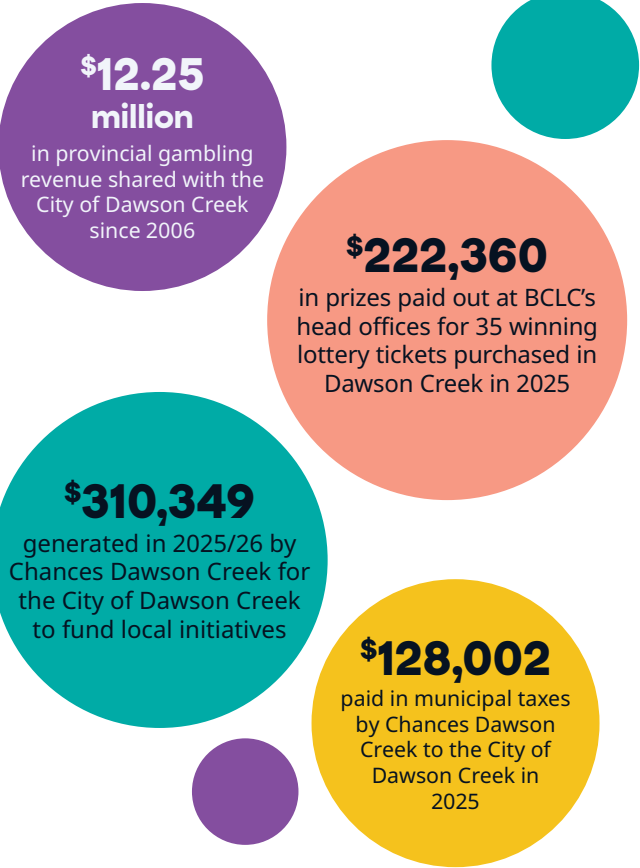

Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2025/26, BCLC generated \$83.4 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

# Funds Local Initiatives in Dawson Creek

# Dawson Creek Benefits

In 2025, the City of Dawson Creek allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue to support several local organizations and services. The largest portion was directed to the Dawson Creek Public Library to help maintain public access to resources, programs, and services.

Additional grants included:

- Dawson Creek Exhibition Association to support community events and facility use
- Step Up and Ride to support accessible local transportation
- Dawson Creek Art Gallery for operations and arts programming
- Mile Zero Park Society to assist with park operations and maintenance

These contributions supported a range of community amenities across transportation, arts, recreation, and literacy in Dawson Creek throughout the year.

## Community Support

Chances Dawson Creek made community contributions totalling \$12,543 in 2025, supporting South Peace Community Resources, Outlines for Life, Step Up & Ride, Networks Ministries, Nawican Friendship Centre, Dawson Creek Art Gallery, and South Peace Emergency Response Team. Chances Dawson Creek team members organized and led two fundraisers through the Staff Action Committee. They also organized \$1,500 in in-kind donations of food and toys for the DC Charity Society.
