Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2025/26, BCLC generated \$83.4 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

Maple Ridge Benefits

In 2025, the City of Maple Ridge used its share of provincial gambling revenue to support community safety, parks, recreation, transportation, and neighbourhood improvements. Funding helped enhance public spaces, improve local infrastructure, and expand opportunities for residents to stay active and connected.

Funding supported:

- Downtown security, beautification, and enhanced town centre maintenance
- Neighbourhood development initiatives and seniors' community programming
- Recreation and sport facility improvements, including park and baseball diamond upgrades
- Tree planting, neighbourhood park improvements, and community special events
- Road rehabilitation, street light upgrades, and construction of a new multi-use pathway on Thorne Avenue

These investments helped strengthen neighbourhoods, improve public spaces and transportation, and enhance recreation opportunities for Maple Ridge residents throughout the year.

LOCAL IMPACT

Community Support

Chances Maple Ridge provided financial donations and sponsorship support to a range of local organizations and initiatives in 2025. Donations were made to Alisa's Wish, Friends in Need Food Bank, Coldest Night walk, and Ridge Meadows Hospital Foundation, among others. Sponsorships supported the Ridge Meadows Community Foundation golf tournament, Maple Ridge Hospital Fun Run, and the Ridge Meadows Hospice charity run.
