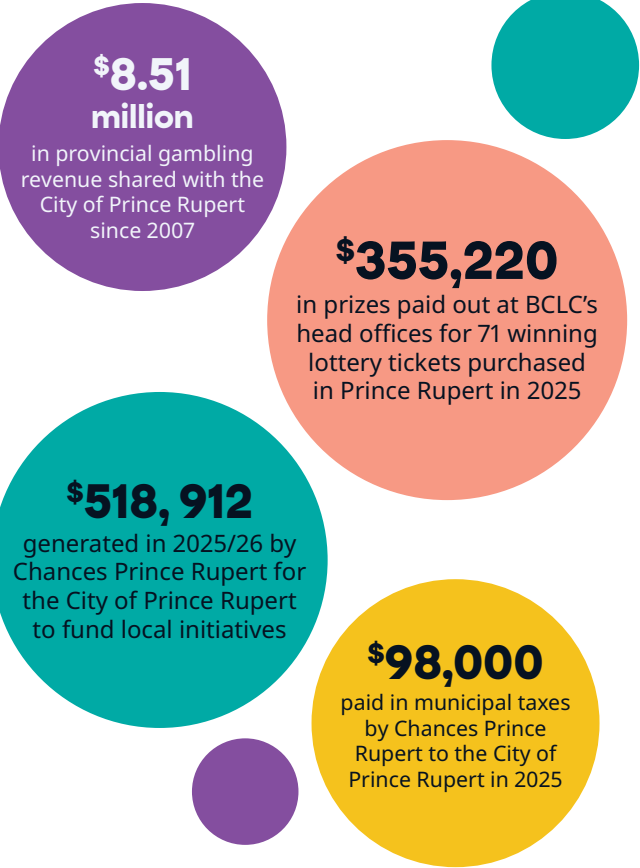

Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2025/26, BCLC generated \$83.4 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

# Funds Local Initiatives in Prince Rupert

Last year, the Province of B.C. allocated \$140 million to not-for-profit organizations through the Community Gaming Grants program.



BCLC launched a new Scratch & Win ticket the “Greater Good Giveaway” which offers a Top Prize of \$10,000 for the winner and \$10,000 for their registered charity of choice, selected from a list of British Columbia charities on CanadaHelps. The ticket aligns strongly with our social purpose, to generate win-wins for the greater good, and we believe that when we share the wins, we are more connected to each other, our communities and our province.

# Prince Rupert Benefits

In 2025, the City of Prince Rupert allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue to support both community programming and infrastructure improvements. A portion of the funds was distributed as grants to local organizations, including \$20,000 to the Prince Rupert Arts Council, \$159,000 to the Lester Centre of the Arts, \$159,358 to the Museum of Northern BC, \$15,000 to the Kwinitsa Railway Station Museum, and \$30,000 to the Prince Rupert Special Events Society. The remaining funds were invested in road paving as part of the city's ongoing capital improvements.
