Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2025/26, BCLC generated \$83.4 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

Local Impact

In addition to supporting community initiatives, River Rock Casino Resort also contributes to the local economy by sourcing supplies and services from a range of local vendors. In 2025, River Rock spent over \$8 million in the local economy, through vendors including Parker Place Florist, Choi Kee Trading Ltd., and The Lighting Warehouse.

DID YOU KNOW

Greater Good Giveaway

BCLC launched a new Scratch & Win ticket the "Greater Good Giveaway" which offers a Top Prize of \$10,000 for the winner and \$10,000 for their registered charity of choice, selected from a list of British Columbia charities on CanadaHelps. The ticket aligns strongly with our social purpose, to generate win-wins for the greater good, and we believe that when we share the wins, we are more connected to each other, our communities and our province.

Richmond Benefits

In 2025, the City of Richmond received a total of \$11.32 million in provincial gambling revenue. These funds were allocated to a variety of community initiatives and infrastructure projects, including:

- \$978,858 in support of the Richmond RCMP
- \$2.875 million allocated to a variety of community grants
- \$230,000 to support Council Community initiatives
- \$834,149 placed into Capital Reserves for current and future projects
- \$6.4 million applied to the Steveston Community Centre and Library construction loan

Some of the projects partially funded by these reserves in recent years included:

- Building envelope and structural renewals at the historic Britannia Shipyards
- Replacement of the Works Yard facility
- Upgrades to Richmond Fire Hall No. 7 on No. 6 Road
- Renewal of Steveston and South Arm outdoor pools
- Infrastructure repairs to the Richmond Curling Club

LOCAL IMPACT

Community Support

In 2025, River Rock Casino Resort contributed to the Richmond community through both financial and in-kind donations, as well as local sponsorships. The site distributed over \$150,000 in donations to multiple local organizations including their signature charity: Pathways Clubhouse, along with the Richmond Chinese Community Society, Richmond Firefighters Charitable Society, BC Foster Parent Association, Dreams Take Flight, and the Richmond Food Bank. The resort also sponsored the 20th Annual BC Gaming Facilities Charity Golf Tournament which raised over \$50,000 for BC Children's Hospital and \$10,000 for Make-A-Wish Canada.

In addition, River Rock provided \$266,764 in gift certificates to 150 community organizations. These in-kind contributions included combinations of hotel stays, food credits, and free play, used to support
