In fiscal year 2025/26, the Province of B.C. distributed \$95.2 million to First Nations in B.C. as part of the BC First Nations Revenue Sharing Limited Partnership. First Nations receive a seven percent entitlement of BCLC's net income through the BC First Nations Gaming Revenue Sharing Limited Partnership.

Funds Local Initiatives in Squamish

Last year, the Province of B.C. allocated \$140 million to not-for-profit organizations through the Community Gaming Grants program.

Community Gaming Grants

Last year, 14 human and social services along with sport focused organizations in Squamish received Community Gaming Grants, totalling \$670,200. This funding supports the delivery of accessible and inclusive programs and services within the community. Organizations in Squamish that received a Community Gaming Grant last year include:
