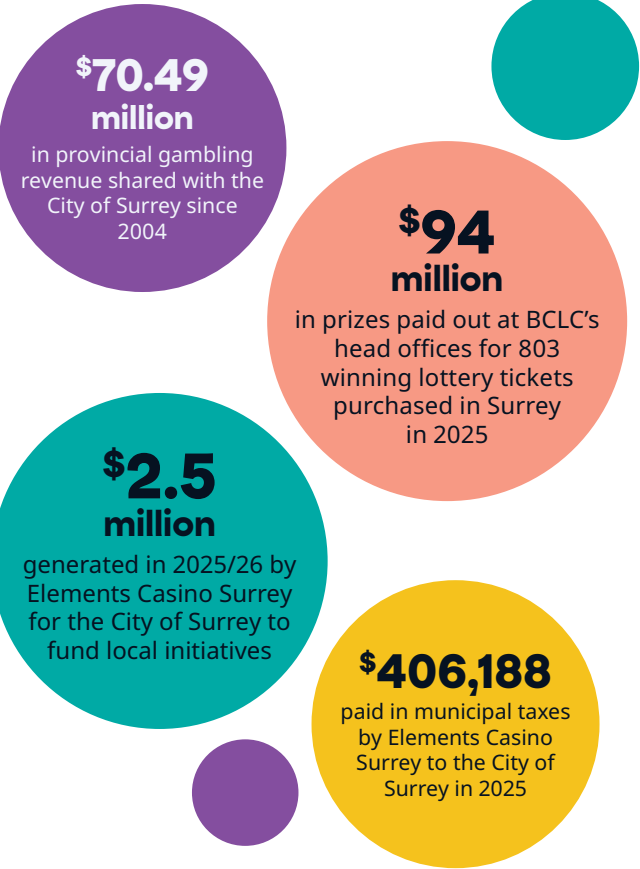

Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2025/26, BCLC generated \$83.4 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

GAMBLING REVENUE

Funds Local Initiatives in Surrey

Last year, the Province of B.C. allocated \$140 million to not-for-profit organizations through the Community Gaming Grants program.

Local Impact

In addition to supporting community initiatives, Elements Casino Surrey also contributes to the local economy by sourcing supplies and services from a range of local vendors. In 2025, Elements Casino Surrey spent over \$10 million in the local economy through more than 50 vendors, some of which include Tornado Building Maintenance, Peninsula Wall & Ceiling, Southridge Building Supplies, Douglas Lake Equipment Ltd., and RCB Upholstery.

Surrey Benefits

In 2025, the City of Surrey allocated a portion of the provincial gambling revenue it received for hosting Elements Casino Surrey to a third artificial turf field at Tamanawis Park.

The Tamanawis Park Third Artificial Turf Field project delivers an elite level synthetic field hockey pitch at Tamanawis Park in Surrey's Newton neighbourhood. The project expands an established field hockey complex, making Tamanawis Park the only facility in Canada with three water-based, high performance field hockey fields at a single location, supporting community recreation and inviting national-level competition.

LOCAL IMPACT

Community Support

In 2025, Elements Casino Surrey supported a variety of local organizations through donations, sponsorships, and volunteer efforts. Beneficiaries included the Cloverdale Community Kitchen, Blue Foundation's Coldest Night of the Year Walk, and Starfish Lunch Program.

Additional support was provided to Peace Arch Hospice Society, Surrey Libraries, and the Surrey Food Bank. Elements Casino Surrey team members volunteered nearly 140 hours to support Coldest Night of the Year Walk, Cloverdale Community Kitchen, car washes, and bake sales.

BCLC was proud to sponsor the 77th annual Cloverdale Rodeo, one of Western Canada's biggest and most unique events. This event is a community staple, bringing people together to enjoy rides, music, attractions, food and of course, world-class rodeo competitions.
