Each year, municipal and First Nations governments in B.C. that host a gambling facility typically receive a 10 per cent share of net gambling income generated at those facilities. In fiscal year 2025/26, BCLC generated \$83.4 million for the Province to distribute to 33 Host Local Governments across B.C. to fund local projects and initiatives.

Workplace Diversity
Every year, Parq champions workplace diversity and inclusive employment; the percentage of staff drawn from the local community sits consistently between 25-30%, while in 2025 the percentage of visible minorities in their workforce measured nearly 32%.



SPONSORSHIP
Khatsalano

BCLC was proud to support Khatsalano Street Party, Vancouver's largest free music and arts festival. Created in 2011 by members of the community, this event features live entertainment by Vancouver's top musical performers and showcases local artisans and street performers. This event connects the community through arts & culture, food and beverage, giveaways and special activities to celebrate summer.

YOU PLAY
Vancouver Benefits

In 2025, the City of Vancouver allocated its share of provincial gambling revenue equally between public safety services and citywide services, including community services, parks, and recreation. Selected initiatives supported in part by annual HLG funding in 2025 were:

- Community Services - supporting parks and public spaces as places for cultural expression, community connection, and creativity with a focus on elevating the visibility, presence, and cultural stewardship of xʷməθkʷəy̓əm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and səliłwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) First Nations.
- Public Safety – investing in Vancouver Fire and Rescue Services and the Vancouver Police Department as part of the City's prioritization of public safety.
- Vancouver Public Library - maintaining high-quality library services, and expanding library facilities, while ensuring services are delivered efficiently and aligned with the City's focus on maintaining affordability.

LOCAL IMPACT
Community Support
In 2025, Parq Casino supported several community organizations through partnerships and donations, including the YWCA Metro Vancouver, Vancouver Chinatown Foundation, Downtown Eastside Women's Centre, and the Dr. Peter Centre.
Parq has funded over 5,000 meals for food insecure individuals and repurposed over 2,500 items of clothing, textile and technology destined for landfill. In 2025, Parq continued its annual contribution of \$300,000 to St. Paul's Hospital to help fund the groundbreaking work of the BC Centre on Substance Use.
As part of its Community Benefits Agreement with the City of Vancouver, Hastings Racecourse hosted ten Community Days where local charities are invited to host a fundraiser at the site. In addition to any money raised at their hosted event, beneficiaries also received a \$5,000 cash donation plus \$1,500 in in-kind support from Hastings. Some of the organizations supported in 2025 were Employ to Empower, Ronald McDonald House BC & Yukon, and the Greater Vancouver Food Bank.
