Re: Request for Records: BCLC File 19-095

British Columbia Lottery Corporation (BCLC) writes further to your December 5, 2019 request under B.C.'s Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA) and BCLC's letter dated December 9, 2019.

You requested:

"Please provide all international travel records and related records for Jim Lightbody, Brad Desmarais and Robert Kroeker in the year of 2017, (Jan. 1 2017 to Dec. 31 2017) with regards to casino business in MACAU (a.k.a. Macao) including but not limited to costs, agenda, records of recorded meetings with professionals, officials or business persons, itinerary, expense claims and notes."

BCLC is providing 57 pages of records in response to your request.

Some information has been withheld from disclosure under sections 17 and 22 of FIPPA. Disclosure of this information could reasonably be expected to harm the financial or economic interests of BCLC and would be an unreasonable invasion of personal privacy. Below are the reasons for withholding information under each of the exceptions to disclosure noted.

Section 17 (financial or economic interests)

The information withheld under this section is harmful to BCLC's financial or economic interests because disclosure would reveal plans that relate to the administration of a public body that have not yet been implemented or made public. Additionally, disclosure of the information would reveal commercially sensitive information about potential new products and services being contemplated and would provide BCLC competitors with valuable information. Further, disclosure would reveal information about negotiations carried on by BCLC.

Section 22 (personal privacy)

The information withheld under this section includes the signatures of BCLC employees, employee numbers, credit card and loyalty/membership card information, and information about personal vehicles. Information withheld under this section also includes personalized registration codes, barcodes, and confirmation numbers that may facilitate access to the personal information of BCLC employees when used in combination with other available information. Disclosure of this information would be an unreasonable invasion of personal privacy. Additionally, please note that some of the travel expense receipt totals are shown in the local currency and not in Canadian dollars.
